## The Stratford Festival of Canada

Their names are legendary now, but in 1952 they were simply visionary people with a unique idea: to establish a festival of Shakespearean theatre in the small southwestern Ontario city of Stratford. They were Stratford-born journalist Tom Patterson, respected stage director Tyrone Guthrie and renowned designer Tanya Moiseiwitsch. Their dream came true on the night of July 13, 1953, when actor Alec Guinness stepped onto Moiseiwitsch's revolutionary thrust stage, erected under a specially constructed tent, to speak the opening words of *Richard III*. An extraordinary adventure in Canadian cultural life had begun.

In the years since, internationally acclaimed performers such as Brian Bedford, Douglas Campbell, Brent Carver, Hume Cronyn, Cynthia Dale, Colm Feore, Megan Follows, Lorne Greene, Paul Gross, Julie Harris, Martha Henry, William Hutt, James Mason, John Neville, Nicholas Pennell, Christopher Plummer, Douglas Rain, Kate Reid, Jason Robards, Paul Scofield, William Shatner, Maggie Smith, Jessica Tandy, Peter Ustinov and Al Waxman have graced the stages at the Stratford Festival. The Festival has set benchmarks for the production of theatre, both classical and contemporary, on the North American continent.

Today the Festival employs more than 840 people, (460 year round) features 750 performances over a 30 week season in four theatres, records more than 600,000 admissions each year and brings more than \$180 million annually to the regional economy.

Four percent of the Festival's revenue now comes from government funding and it has achieved a higher percentage of earned revenue against operating expenses than any other arts organization in Canada.

In 2002, the Avon Theatre was completely renovated with new seating, lighting, foyer, theatre store and restrooms. A fourth theatre space, The Studio Theatre, was added. This 250 seat theatre is a home to new works, experimental work and rarely produced plays. These additions celebrate the milestone of 50 seasons of outstanding Canadian theatre.
